Finance Report: Upper Hutt report was tabled and accepted, as was the Levy Report.

Correspondence: Interest from Hamilton WMC to host the 2024 North Island tournament. Upper Hutt moved that this be accepted, seconded Castlecliff. Passed. There has been no interest for 2025.

General Business: Castlecliff moved that the entry for the North Island Tournament be increased to \$15 per player, per event, seconded Waipa. Alton Heaslip briefly outlined the reasons, namely that it has not increased for several years and it is becoming more difficult to get sponsors, so an increase may allow smaller clubs to run the event. Castlecliff asked that Clubs that have previously played in the event but have not for several years be taken of the list of participants. St John's seconded the request and it was CARRIED.

Lesley Monk from Hamilton Workingmen's Club outlined the playing venues and presented an accommodation guide for 2024.
