Remits:

Remit 1: Proposed by Papakura Mah Jong Club. Seconded by Waiuku Club

1. That East passes on every hand except for the dead wall when East continues for one more hand.

Reason 1: To share the points and make it more equitable. Reason 2: In line with what interclub tournaments are doing

As Remit 1 and Remit 3 (1) are similar, a Vote was carried out on which proposal the Delegates wanted to adopt.

Remit 3: Proposed by Whangamata RSA. Seconded by Whangamata Club

1. Change Rule 6.

Players cannot remain East Wind for more than three consecutive turns to

East always passes to the next player regardless of the outcome.

Rationale: To give a more even distribution of points

1. Change to Rule 18

Play consists of 16 hands for sessions 1, 2 and 3 and 12 hands for sessions 4, 5 and 6. Change to:

Play consists Of 14 hands for sessions 1, 2 and 3 and 12 hands for sessions 4, 5 and 6

2. Alter Rule 19

Players must state Fishing before declaring a Mah Jong Change to

Players may declare Fishing (and put their fish token up) at any time during the game before a Mah Jong is declared. '1F' to be entered on the score sheet after the hand has been checked. A Fishing point cannot be claimed if Fishing has not been declared and token placed on the board. Rationale: To give more clarity to players.

3. Add new hand.

Apple Blossom – play Pung of White Dragons, Pair of Green Dragons, 3 mixed Chows – 2 points

4. Add new hand.

Dragon's Run – play One of EACH Dragon, a pair of Winds and a Run of 1-9 in any suit – 2 points

PASSED

5. Add new hand

Hopscotch – play 1, 3, 5 in one suit. 1, 3, 5, 7 in second suit. 1, 3 5, 7, 9 in third suit. Pair of Winds or Dragons – 2 points

PASSED

6. Add new hand

Broken Gates – play Run 2-8 in 1 suit plus 1 tile paired. Number 1 in each suit. Number 9 in each suit – 3 points

PASSED

7. Add new hand

Eternal Triangle – play One of EACH Dragon, One of EACH Wind, plus a wind paired and a pair in each suit – 2 points

PASSED

- 8. Remove Greta's Garden 2 points **FAILED**
- 9. Remove Confused Gates 4 points **FAILED**
